
RANZCOG ASM

Course Overview:

- This meeting is a 1/2-day event (x4 hours) which will take place on Saturday 28th October 2023 before the RANZCOG ASM
- It will involve didactic lectures, case studies and practical demonstration/skills in both diagnostic and operative hysteroscopy
- Workshops using models and computer-simulated procedures will cover diagnostic hysteroscopy, endometrial polypectomy or resection of fibroid/intrauterine adhesions, endometrial ablation and removal of RPOC
- Lectures will cover topics such as patient selection, analgesic options, basic techniques in outpatient hysteroscopy, troubleshooting and topics for research and audit
- There will be opportunity for delegates to improve their hand-eye coordination in hysteroscopic techniques and become familiar with operative hysteroscopy

Who should attend

- Trainees in obstetrics and gynaecology who have not been exposed to outpatient hysteroscopy
- Gynaecologists of any grade who feel that they want to enhance their hysteroscopy skills



Skills Stations

Delegates will be divided into x6 groups of 4 and rotate through the different stations.

The stations will include a diagnostic hysteroscopy station, a tissue retrieval station, an endometrial ablation station and x2 Bozzini models.

This course will provide you with the opportunity to talk to experts 'in the field' and network with key personnel who distribute the various products

Learning Objectives

At the end of this course, delegates should be able to:

- Be familiar with the indications for diagnostic hysteroscopy and know how it is safely performed
- Perform operative hysteroscopy confidently and be familiar with the appropriate equipment to deal with intrauterine pathology
- Select appropriate patients for outpatient hysteroscopy and understand the indications in the outpatient setting
- Perform an outpatient hysteroscopy with minimal discomfort and know when to stop if this cannot be achieved
- Competently manage the stenosed cervix, atrophic vagina, nervous patient etc
- Be familiar with various devices available for performing operative hysteroscopic procedures including removing intrauterine pathology and endometrial ablation


