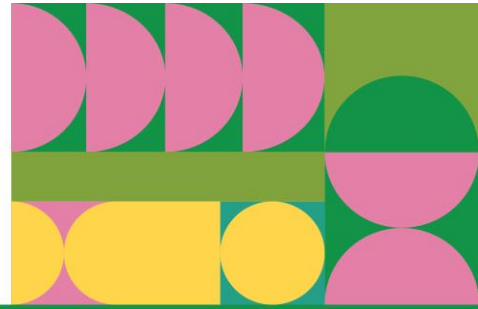

RANZCOG ASM

Course Overview:

- This workshop is a 1/2-day event (x4 hours) which will take place on Saturday 28th October before the RANZCOG ASM
- Lectures will cover topics such as pelvic anatomy, fundamentals of safe laparoscopic surgery, electrosurgical principals, entry techniques, basic steps of TLH, challenging patients, troubleshooting and topics for research and audit
- Using state-of-the-art models, participants will cover skills including morcellation, safe application of live energy, TLH/BSO and laparoscopic suturing/knot tying
- There will be opportunity for delegates to improve their hand-eye coordination in laparoscopic techniques and become familiar with laparoscopic suturing/knot tying
- The ratio of facilitator to participant is 3:1 giving participants ample opportunity to discuss challenging surgical situations and have 1-on-1 supervision and assistance from experts in the field

Who should attend

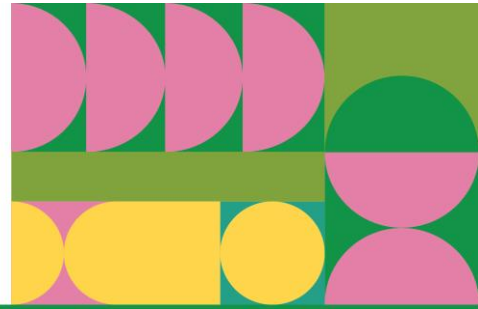
- Trainees in obstetrics and gynaecology with any level of exposure to laparoscopic surgery
- Specialist gynaecologists of any grade who wish to enhance their laparoscopic skills

Skills Stations

Delegates will be divided into x8 groups of 3 and rotate through several stations.

The stations will include vaginal cuff models, tissue suturing models, lap GYN models (for BSO and hysterectomy).

In addition, there will be 2 stations for manual morcellation via contained extraction and a live energy station using chicken skin.



This course will provide you with the opportunity to talk to experts 'in the field' and network with key personnel who distribute the various products.

This course is suitable for CPD points.

Learning Objectives

At the end of this course, delegates should be able to:

- Perform operative laparoscopy confidently
- Be familiar with the indications for diagnostic laparoscopy and the appropriate equipment to deal with pelvic pathology
- Select appropriate patients for laparoscopy, perform laparoscopy safely and understand indications for laparoscopy in the emergency setting
- Competently manage the patient with raised BMI, complex surgical history, etc
- Gain an understanding of the basic steps of a TLH +/- BSO and be familiar with various devices available for performing laparoscopic procedures

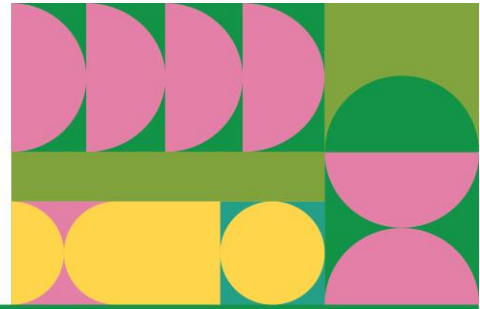
